Program Details

Upon entry, each resident works with staff to establish individualized goals designed to overcome the obstacles to permanent, independent living in recovery. Each resident is required to work, pay a small program fee, maintain his own living area, share the cooking and cleaning responsibilities, participate in a life skills curriculum, substance abuse education, case management and community volunteer activities.

With recovery at the forefront, the Samartian Inn program helps to guide a man toward achieving his goals. Upon completion of the program, a man is fully immersed in recovery, is employed, and has attained safe, affordable housing. Upon graduation, the Samaritan Inn will offer up to \$1,000.00 in transitional fees.

Charleston



Charleston. The Capital City. Situated at the confluence of the Elk and Kanawha Rivers, Charleston is the most populous city in West Virginia. Settled in the late 18th century, this frontier town has seen many changes over the centuries. As of 2020, Charleston consists of an estimated 48,864 residents, while the metro-area contains roughly 208,089 permanent residents. Charleston is home to many award-winning hopsitals and healthcare systems, plus nationally ranked colleges and universities that include the University of Charleston, West Virginia State University, plus branch campuses of West Virginia University and Marshall University.

As a cultural hub of the state, Charleston boasts many museums and attractions including Kanawha State Forest, The Clay Center, The West Virginia Museum, Haddad Riverfront Park, and the nationally distributed Mountain Stage on NPR.

Located at the intersection of Interstates 64, 77, and 79, the Capital City affords easy access to other regional metro areas within 500 miles including Indianapolis, Cincinnati, Columbus, Lexington, Louisville, Pittsburgh, Philadelphia, Baltimore, Washington, Charlotte, Atlanta, and Nashville.
